Where Do You Get Your Identity? Discovering who you are 8/27/2017 Sunday AM

Scripture: John 14:8-11 and Matthew 16:13-20

Introduction

- Last week we spoke about Do You Want to be Rich or Poor? Relying on God for Daily Bread.
- We discussed how we should rely on God daily for our needs and not seek the extremes.
- We should be content in God's provisions for our life because He always provides more than we deserve.
- This morning we are going to discuss Where Do You Get You Identity? Discovering who you are.
- Many people in our world today are having an "identity crisis" and they are trying to "discover themselves."
- Some people seem to spend a lifetime trying to understand who they are, only to not find an answer.
- They do not find a suitable answer because they were looking in all of the wrong places.
- In order to understand who you are, you must first find the source of your identity.

John 14:8-11

⁸Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us."

⁹Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you are not just my own. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. ¹¹Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the miracles themselves.

- The disciples were at the Last Supper and Jesus was explaining to them that He was going away.
- Philip as Jesus in v. 8 to "show us the Father..."
- Jesus' response in v. 9 is hard hitting, "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"?"
- It appeared that Philip did not know who Jesus was, even after he had walked with Him for years.
- The disciples could not understand the things that Jesus was saying because they really still did not fully understand who He was.
- Their lack of understanding is confusing in light of the conversation that they had with Jesus earlier.

Matthew 16:13-20

¹³When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" ¹⁴They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets." ¹⁵"But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" ¹⁶Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." ¹⁷Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by man, but by my Father in heaven. ¹⁸And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. ¹⁹I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." ²⁰Then he warned his disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.

- Jesus had this conversation with His disciples way before the Last Supper.
- Jesus asked all of the disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?
- The "Son of Man" implied the Messiah that was promised.
- After they responded Jesus then makes a bold assertion and asks in v. 15, "Who do you say I am?"
- He was claiming here by asking this question that He in face was the Messiah.
- Peter responded by saying he believed Jesus was "the Christ, the Son of the living God."
- The disciple all knew from this conversation "who" Jesus was because of what v. 20 says.

- As a Christian, it is very important for you to understand who Jesus is.
- The disciples knew who Jesus was, but they did not understand who He was.
- This is why they were so confused with the events that unfolded in Jesus' last days on earth.
- Because of their lack of understand as to who Jesus was, they also had an identity crisis themselves.
- In order to discover who you are, you must understand who He is.
- In the world today, we are looking in all of the wrong place trying to find ourselves and discover ourselves.
- College students study abroad and take time off from school to discover themselves.
- People read books and listen to secular speakers trying to understand who they really are.
- When all our eyes are set on this world as the source of our identity, we will always come up short.
- In Psalm 23 you get the idea that you are a sheep when you read the Psalm, why is that?
- Because the first words of the Psalm identify who the Lord is, "The LORD is my Shepherd, I shall not be in want..."
- We cannot possible discover who we are, unless we understand who God is. He is the source of our identity.
- I know that I am His son, because He tells me He is my Father.
- Who do you say He is?
